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ABSTRACT

This study aims to examine the concept of the grammatical government in interpreting vocal and semantic changes that occur in the suffix of some words as a result of their varied position in the sentences. It also endeavours to discover aspects of link between heritage of Arab classical grammarians and contribution of early modern Arab linguists towards construction of Arabic sentences. The researcher adopts a theoretical and analytical works in tracing the development of the grammatical government in the method of writings of classical grammarians such as Sibawayh, al-Jurj n , Ibn Jinn , al-Anb r , Ibn Ya  sh and Ibn Hish m; and in assessing the position of their supporters and opponents such as Ibn Ma  , Ibr h m Mu  taf , Tam m Hass n, Abd al-Ra  m n Muhammad Ayy b,  Abduh al-R jih  and al-Badr w   ahr n most especially in their works on interpretation of the vocal and semantic change in the suffix of some words. In this study, the researcher attempts to highlight the degree of effectiveness of the grammatical government in the constructions of sentences, analyzes the long lasting conflict between the classical and early modern grammarians about its functional role, and establishes a framework of epistemological integration that will contribute to the utilization of the literature of these classical grammarians and contributions of the early modern Arab linguists in producing a better understanding of the role of grammatical government in studying the linguistic issues and their grammatical problems.
